HOW WE BEGAN

 Prior to the year 2000, the Kentucky Fire Commission was a division of the Kentucky State Fire Marshal, while State Fire Rescue Training (SFRT) was part of the Workforce Development Cabinet.

 A merger in 2000 brought together the Kentucky Fire Commission and SFRT and aligned the new organization with KCTCS.

FIRE COMMISSION BOARD

- Fire Commission board members are appointed by the governor. The Commission is an 18-seat board comprised of:
 - 14 voting members
 - 3 non-voting members
 - 1 Ex-Officio member

FUNDING OF THE FIRE COMMISSION

The Fire Commission & State Fire Rescue Training operational budgets for this year are \$59,101,700. The funds come from the insurance surcharge of a tax rate of 1.8% and state general fund dollars.

Grants, loans & State Aid available through the Fire Commission

Training Facility Grant: Grants are available each year to Fire Departments in the Commonwealth for the purpose of constructing new or upgrading existing training centers.

Thermal Imaging Camera (TIC) grant: Grant program designed to reduce and prevent the loss of life by creating better equipped firefighters throughout the commonwealth.

State Aid (KRS): The Kentucky Fire Commission allots funding each year to qualifying volunteer fire department in cities of all classes.

Low Interest Loans: Loans are made available to departments who achieve the training standards necessary to qualify for volunteer Dept aid and which do not have other sources of funding at rates which are favorable to their financial resources.

Training Facility Grants

- KRS 95A.262, 739 KAR 2:030
- Awarded annually through an application process and selection by the Grants Committee.
- Amount increased to 1 million per year
- FY 2024 \$999,960 distributed to 31 departments out of 63 applicants

Thermal Imaging Camera (TIC) Grants

- KRS 95A.440, 730 KAR 2:130
- Awarded annually through an application process and selection by the Grants Committee.
- KRS 95.440 requires a two year non-eligibility period.
- \$3500 per grant recipient.
- FY 2024 \$1,417,500 distributed to 405 departments

Additional Grant Programs

During the past five years, the Fire Commission has provided an additional \$5 million in grants to Kentucky's fire service

State Aid

- KRS 95A.262, 739 KAR 2:050
- The State Aid program is available to all qualifying volunteer departments in the Commonwealth.
- Amount increased from \$11,000 to \$15,000 per year.
- List of approved purchases available on the Fire Commission website.

Low Interest Loans

- KRS 95A.262, 730 KAR 2:070
- Low interest loans are available to any volunteer fire department that is in good standing to receive State Aid and has also received that funding for the past 3 consecutive years.
- Departments may borrow up to \$125,000.00
- FY 2024 \$1, 322,372.98 loaned to 17 departments
